

University of Scranton, Weiss Hall:

Creating a hub for experiential learning

Robert S. and Marilyn A. Weiss Hall at the University of Scranton serves as a vibrant center for learning, research, and community outreach. The building's design honors the university's history while embracing modern innovation and well-being.

Located in Scranton, Pennsylvania, Weiss Hall spans nearly 90,000 square feet. The LEED Silver-certified building incorporates a combination of steel, stone, natural wood, and glass elements to create a modern aesthetic that beautifully complements the University's 19th-century roots. The entrance features a light-filled atrium with large glass walls and bleacher seating. A selection of lounge seating and a harvest table with stools

provide a welcoming space for staff, students and the community to connect. Designed as a flexible and future-ready environment for experiential learning, Weiss Hall includes a variety of classrooms, offices, training spaces, and labs. Mobile tables and chairs can be reconfigured to enable rooms to adapt as needs change.

In keeping with the Jesuit principles on which the school is founded, Weiss Hall also offers spaces that support students' physical, mental, and spiritual well-being, including self-care and prayer areas, as well as two rooftop terraces.
